The Philippines is highly prone to disaster and climate crisis-driven impact. Based on a study of the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical, and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA), heavy rainfall will continue to persist in the Luzon and Visayas islands and is expected to increase, become more frequent, and cover all parts of the country until 2025. In 2021, fifteen (15) tropical cyclone events hit the Philippines which severely damaged the livelihood of the vulnerable sectors. One of the strongest typhoons experienced in 2021 was Typhoon Rai that left 10.8 million families devastated and caused losses worth Php 11.1 billion.

As our commitment to contribute solutions in addressing the climate crisis, the **Youth for Just Transition** will conduct a gathering of young individuals from seven (7) sectors namely: Journalism and Media, Transport, Labor, Academia, Indigenous Groups, Advocates, and Out-of-school youth to discuss Just Transition, its intersectionalities, and relevance in addressing the impacts of the climate crisis. The main goal of the activity is to brainstorm possible youth-led and youth-driven real and sustainable solutions that will 1) ensure equitable outcomes for all; 2) actualize transition to a low-carbon economy; and, 3) utilize available resources to maximize climate action while minimizing probable challenges.

The Youth for Just Transition is a coalition of advocacy organizations that envisions the actualization of just transition in the Philippines. Through a multi-disciplinary approach, the coalition wishes to integrate sector-specific issues, formulate plans that will address the intersectionalities, and implement solutions that are democratic and just.

The Youth Camp is set to happen on 10 - 13 November 2022 at Mt Purro Nature Reserve, Antipolo, Rizal. An online pre-camp orientation will be held from 6:00 - 8:00p.m. on 8 November 2022.

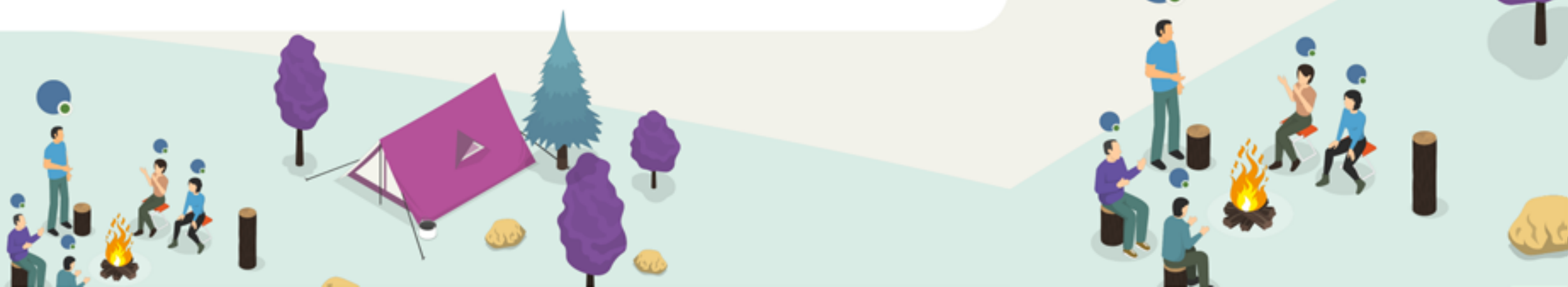
WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?
